

Good Beginnings

- show, don't tell
- begin in the middle of the action (not at the literal beginning of the story, you can fill in details as you go along)
- use a lot of action at the beginning
- Use a creative title
- Introduce characters
- Withhold important details to make your reader want to read on (Create suspense)
- Ask a question
- Say something unusual
- Make the reader want to figure out what will happen next
- Start with a metaphor, simile or analogy
- Start with a striking or controversial statement
- Describe something in vivid detail (ie. the setting)
- The ending should usually some how tie back to the beginning
- Set a mood
- Use 1st or 3rd person narration
